Resolved. That this convention present their thanks  
to their female friends. for the deep interest they  
have manifested during in the Anti Slavery cause  
during the prolonged Session of this body.

On motion of N. Southard - Seconded by A. P. Wakefield  
Resolved. That we hail the establishment of Ladies  
Anti Slavery Societies as the harbingers of brighter days  
and that we feel great confidence in the efficiency  
of their exertions. and that those ladies who have promptly  
come forward in this great work are deserving the  
thanks of those who are ready to perish,

Unanimous

having but one specific object  
Resolved, that as abolitionists, we meet together on common ground,  
that this Society had nothing to do with the peculiar sectional or political  
views of any of its members, or pledge to give the right hand of fellow-  
ship to all the friends of the slave who will meet as on this common  
platform, & that we deprecate the formation of any new org Society  
based on political or sectional grounds.
